- Mr. John Phelan called the LABBB Board meeting to order at 9:03 am.
- Public Participation, No public participation.
- Recommended Action Items:
  - Dr. Eric Conti made a motion to approve meeting minutes of *April 7, 2022*, Seconded by *Dr. Elizabeth Homan*, all in favor. 4-0.

Presentation - FY2023 Preliminary Budget/Spending plan for 22/23

- LABBB FY23 Budget Delayed until 6/16/2022
  - Tuition will not change from preliminary presentation
  - 2.5% increase
  - Build in breathing room on our side to help districts with 45 day Assessments
    - Adding 1 TA & 1 Specialist to help –
    - Still determining what to do with extra staff if we don't have a 45 day assessment'
    - Currently will just represent hiring slack for FY23
    - John Phelan thinks program is fantastic/the need is huge
- Discussion Items
  - Current Enrollment
    - Current enrollment is at 288
      - Down 3 enrollments (almost \$200K in budget terms)
      - Big picture- need to build out hiring / recruitment
- Collective Bargaining

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• Interim Executive Director updated the board on negotiations

- Van Purchases
  - Expecting to come in by the end of June
  - Wheelchair vans to be longer
    - Will extend current ACT leases as needed on (month to month basis)
  - ACT open to selling two currently leased vans to Burlington
    - still determining pricing
- Vocational Programming
  - o Watertown very open to us participating in their Vocational Program
  - Issue is high school will not have space for 2 years
  - There will be room at the elementary level but not the middle school level
  - $\circ$  Vocational Program will be in the basement and no room for us
  - Watertown presently has 6 kids attending LABBB
  - Based on 2011 Collaborative Commission, new Collaborative members must be initiated by School Committee 180 days before the FY ends
  - Special Ed Director could come as an observer to meetings while everything it getting into place
  - Dr. Eric Conti a little reluctant to expand, wants to make sure we keep LABBB a "Small Community"
    - Watertown needs to meet criteria
    - Downside is getting too big & uncontrollable
  - Mr. John Phelan says it's exciting, but reinforce LABBB's history/culture
    - Doesn't want to get too big & uncontrollable
    - What is best way to respond if other towns want to join
  - $\circ~$  Dr. Bill Lupini will meet with Watertown's board
  - When their high school is done they will have room for us
  - $\circ~$  Dr. Liz Homan likes the idea but also agrees doesn't want it to get too big
  - Dr. Eric Conti asking to put into writing professional, respectful words of keeping it small if others want to join.
    - Have to revisit the agreement to spell out clearly
  - o People need to invest in stabilization, need guardrails to maintain stability
  - $\circ~$  Dr. Julie Hackett a little nervous but will do what the majority says
- Special Olympics
  - Dr. Bill Lupini praised the districts for the Best Buddies Program and how helpful they were that day
